

Church Council Meeting Minutes

Pleasant Grove United Methodist Church Council Meeting

August 27, 2023

Call to Order

Buck Green, Council Chair, opened the meeting with prayer at 11:05 a.m.

Report of the Pastor

Mr. Green called upon Pastor Glenda Bennett. Ms. Bennett questioned the Council, “What is your vision for Pleasant Grove?” She asked that members of the Council ponder the question and communicate to her any and all thoughts and recommendations for growth. Ms. Bennett encouraged the formation of an ad-hoc committee to look at various opportunities in which the community and congregation might intersect in order to reach more people. She stressed that reaching individuals for Jesus Christ is her main priority. Next, Ms. Bennett announced her plans to form a prayer group that will convene for approximately ten minutes prior to Sunday School each week. The group will use these weekly sessions to offer fervent and sincere prayers for Pleasant Grove United Methodist Church.

Finance Committee

Mr. Green called upon Pat James, Treasurer, and Scott Brown, Chair of the Committee on Finance, to report upon the current financial situation of the church. Mr. James reiterated that a weekly synopsis of budget vs. expenditures are printed in the bulletin. Today’s report reflects a current deficit of \$40,000.

Mr. Brown announced that weekly teller positions are now filled, and that the current focus of the Committee is how giving might be elevated. Pleasant Grove has suffered in recent years due to the death of numerous members; additionally, many long-time members have moved from the community.

Council members acknowledged that multiple traditional methods previously have been tried with a desire to bolster membership, including Bible School, Trunk-or-Treat, and Day Care and After-School Care programs. Pastor Bennett stressed that Pleasant Grove is not alone in this plight—that all churches are searching for ways to get more people through the doors on Sunday mornings. She has begun working with the Director of the CDC to establish weekly Chapel time with the children. They are also exploring a potential monthly gathering for children and their parents that might foster spiritual engagement.

The question of requesting an increase in the rent paid to the church by the CDC has been considered. The Council was advised that the CDC Committee continues to discuss the matter and is weighing options.

Additionally, it was questioned if consideration has been given to raising rent on the Scout Hut. Mr. McClure, Trustee Chair, advised that the Committee has discussed the matter, but has tabled a decision, given the large sum of money the current occupants have placed into making the property habitable. The Committee has also discussed liquidation of the property, and Mr. McClure stated that if selling becomes feasible, the church will stipulate that Pleasant Grove be allowed to continue using the property for cemetery parking, etc.

Parsonage Committee

Margaret Parker, Chair, reported that repairs and updates to the parsonage have been completed. She expressed gratitude for the many donations given, allowing work to be completed without disturbing the 2023 parsonage Budget.

Staff Parish Committee

Todd Holcomb, Chair, reported that Staff Parish has begun seeking a Financial Secretary to fill the position that will be vacated in November by Lindsay Wright as she transitions into a full-time nursing career. Mr. Holcomb stated that the position has been posted on the website of the Western UMC.

United Women of Faith

Jeannie Upton, Chair, announced that the 2023 Mission Walk will take place on September 23. Participants will walk for two miles. Anyone is welcome to participate, and all donations supporting walkers are certainly Appreciated.

Child Development Center Committee

Lee Nance, Committee member, reported that the Committee continues to study issues related to oversight of the Child Development Center and potential ramifications and liability risks associated with the CDC being under the umbrella of PGUMC. Recognizing the need for legal assistance, the committee has begun an exploration of various options associated with liability, including advisement and discussions with the office of the WNC Conference.

Committee on Trustees

Steve McClure, Chair, reported on the June 25, 2023 meeting of the Committee. The majority of committee discussion centered on the Church van and its safety. Believing it to be in the best interest of all who use the van, Committee recommendation is that the van be sold. Primary usage is for transporting children of the Summer Camp and After-School Care programs. Solutions for safely transferring students from Oakdale School to the church campus are being explored. Motion was made, seconded and unanimously approved that (1) the Trustees continue discussion regarding disposal of the van, and (2) that the Directors of the CDC and After-School Care programs will be put on notice that the Trustees will retire usage of the van as of December 31, 2023. Mr. McClure will convey this decision to the Directors of the CDC and After-School Care, allowing the programs ample opportunity to explore alternative options for transportation.

Mr. McClure reported that a campus security system will soon be installed. Funding to purchase and install the system has been donated to the church by the United Women of Faith. Once installed, surveillance of the parking lots and associated entrances to the front and rear of church buildings will be monitored and recorded.

Hazel Sanders inquired if the Trustees might entertain thoughts of raising the tree and shrubbery canopy surrounding the church. Not only would it make the church more visible, it would lessen the opportunity for damage from falling branches. Ms. Sanders offered to obtain estimates for the tree and shrubbery trimming, and she agreed to work in consultation with the Trustees to bring about and complete the project.

Cemetery Committee

Rick Elliott, Chair, reported that a few cemetery plots recently have been sold.

Other Business

Sherri Brown, Chair of Outreach, commended church members for their response to the request for hygiene bags and uniform donations for Oakdale School. Upcoming outreach projects will include filling Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes and Reverse Advent Calendar food boxes.

Hazel Sanders stated that it soon will be time to present the annual Laity Award. A request for nominations will be printed in the weekly church bulletin.

Mr. Green expressed appreciation to the volunteers who have agreed to act as Sunday-morning parking lot attendants. He also thanked Terri Honeycutt for agreeing to serve as Recording Secretary for the Administrative Council.

Pat James read aloud to the Council correspondence received from the District Superintendent in reply to Pleasant Grove's recent inquiry regarding disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church. The letter of denial from the DS was predicated on the fact that Pleasant Grove's request for disaffiliation missed the stipulated deadline of July 1, 2023. Copies of the correspondence to and the reply from the DS are attached to the minutes as part of the record.

Discussions regarding disaffiliation will continue.

Adjournment

There being no further business, the Council meeting was closed in prayer by Pastor Bennett at 12:10 p.m.

Marinated Vegetable Salad

This recipe comes from a former classroom mother, from my teaching days in Currituck County, who prepared it for a Teacher's Appreciation Day luncheon. Marinated Vegetable Salad


- 1 cup sugar
- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup vinegar
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup vegetable oil
- 1 tsp. pepper
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt
- 1 (16 oz.) can French style green beans, drained
- 1 (17 oz.) can green peas, drained
- 1 (12 oz.) can shoepeg corn, drained
- 1 cup celery, chopped
- 1 red or green bell pepper, finely chopped
- 1 bunch green onions, chopped




Combine the first five ingredients in a medium saucepan. Bring this mixture to a boil, stirring to dissolve the sugar. Let cool. Combine vegetables in a bowl and stir in the cooled vinegar mixture. Cover and chill for at least 8 hours, stirring occasionally. Yields 8-10 servings. Enjoy!


Recommended Reading





Mark Your Calendar!!!
