Inspiration Point

"Put on the garment of Praise for the spirit of heaviness, lift up your voice and sing! Pray in the Spirit and the Understanding, come glorify the King!" It is easy to become depressed during these times, what with the COVID 19 virus keeping us restricted in our movements and even isolated from our loved ones! Fear seems to dominate with most everyone! Then with all the election rhetoric and confusion about that, topped off with not being able to go to church and worship God as we always have done in the past! I have heard several of you talk about being depressed lately.

Have you ever watched the Nature films on TV, where a bunch of lions attack a herd of wildebeasts? They will encircle the herd and chase them until one of the weaker ones falls back by itself. Then they attack that one and bring it down! Well, the Bible tells us about Satan going about like a roaring lion, seeking those whom he may devour! He loves to get a Christian isolated by themselves and begin his attack! He begins by filling their minds with self-doubt, and then by implanting fear into them. That is what is happening during these times when we are afraid to come together to worship God! Our Spirit life begins to weaken, and soon we stop reading our Bibles. Next we begin to confess the wrong things, and as you know, faith comes by hearing the Word of God! After confessing the wrong things and hearing it, we soon begin to believe it. What Do You Say When Asked...

Why do we celebrate Christmas on December 25?

For hundreds of years scholars have attempted to solve this puzzle. A few interesting theories point to his birth on the very day we designate. The early Christian leaders, living only a century or two after Jesus, honored the date of March 25, which they set as the vernal equinox – an important day for the farming-based ancients.

As church traditions continued to be established throughout medieval times, people wanted to celebrate the Nativity itself. It stood to reason that such a day would fall nine months after Gabriel made his proclamation, which everyone connected with March 25. They did the math and came up with December 25, which was the winter solstice. Therefore December 25 became the traditional date for celebrating the Christ Mass.

THE STORY OF SECRET SANTA



In 1971, Larry Stewart was unemployed and broke. He had been a door-to-door salesman until the company he worked for went out of business. Now he was stuck in a small Missouri town with no money and no gas in his car. He hadn't eaten in two days when he entered a small diner one morning and ordered a breakfast he couldn't pay for. When it came time to pay the bill, he pretended he had lost his wallet.

Ted Horner, the owner of the diner, realized what was going on. He walked by the stool where Lee had been sitting and pretended to pick something up off the floor. "Here son," he said, "you must have dropped this." It was a \$20 bill. Larry took it and said "Thanks." He paid his bill, left a tip, pushed his car to the gas station so he could buy gas and leave town.

He knew that no one had dropped the \$20 bill. He knew that the owner had helped him out in a way that wouldn't embarrass him. He said, "Right then I made a promise. I said, 'Lord, if you ever put me in a position to help people, I will do it.'"

A few years later, when he made some money in the cable television industry, he began helping others. It started when he ordered a hamburger at a drive-in. He gave the car-hop \$20 and said, "Keep the change."

She said, "You're kidding."

He said, "No ma'am. Merry Christmas."

Tears filled her eyes and she said, "Sir, you have no idea what this means to me."

This began a custom that Stewart developed over the years of giving away cash to strangers who needed it. Sometimes it's \$100 to someone he sees on the street. Sometimes it's \$1000 to someone who has experienced some kind of tragedy. He gave away more than one million dollars this way, none of it tax-deductible, and always given anonymously.

He was written up in the press as Secret Santa, but no one knew who he was. He revealed his identity when he learned that a tabloid paper was about to publish his name. He was in the midst of fighting a losing battle with cancer; he was pretty sure it would be his last Christmas. He spent the month of December giving away \$100,000 in Missouri, on the streets and in various shelters. He also worked with four newly trained Secret Santas who gave away \$75,000 of their own money.

Before he started this role as a Secret Santa, Stewart says, "I had not found my purpose. Part of my daily prayer was, 'Lord lift me up and let me be a better witness to you and for you and somehow reach more people.' I had no idea this is what He had in mind."


New Sermon Series for December



The Recipe Box



There are so many wonderful recipes out there, with the accessibility of recipe sharing websites. And yet, there are just some recipes that stick and stay in our minds and memories and simply can't be improved upon. We asked Judy Kearns if there was a favorite recipe that used to show up at family gatherings and that she would love to enjoy right now. We thought she might gravitate toward a recipe from her Nanny, Mrs. Ann Kelly. And she did!!!

The story behind this recipe goes something like this... When Judy was a little girl, she gave Nanny a birthday card with a recipe printed on it. Nanny tried the recipe out, was very pleased with the result, and then appropriately named the recipe, Judy's Sugar Cookies. We don't know if this was the start of a shared love of cooking between grandmother and granddaughter, but it most surely encouraged a relationship that had the kitchen as one of its foundations. Judy shares that they are really good sandwich cookies and that she would love to have one right about now!!!

Judy's Sugar Cookies





1 cup sugar

1 egg, well beaten

2 cups all-purpose flour, sifted

2 tsp. baking powder

½ tsp. salt

2 TBSP. milk

1 tsp. vanilla

Cream shortening and sugar. Stir in the beaten egg. Sift flour, baking powder, and salt together. Add alternately with milk and vanilla. Chill in refrigerator for one hour. Drop from a teaspoon and flatten with bottom of glass covered with a damp cloth. Bake @ 350 degrees for 7 – 9 minutes, or until lightly browned.

Chocolate Icing

2 cups sugar

1/3 cup cocoa

½ cup evaporated milk

1 stick butter

1 tsp. vanilla

Mix all ingredients except vanilla. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until mixture comes to a boil. Boil for 3 minutes. Remove from heat and add vanilla. Beat until creamy. Spread icing on bottom of one cookie and top with another cookie! YUM!!!

Recommended Reading




Last month, we extended an invitation to the church family to participate in our Advent Bible study. Now, this month, we would like to encourage each of you to read this book, even if you can't participate in the Bible study. Ann Voskamp's The Greatest Gift: Unwrapping the Full Love Story of Christmas, will do much in the way of centering your heart for Christmas. It is a daily devotional for each day in December, with a scripture passage, a reflection, and then several

thought provoking questions for your individual consideration. Each scripture passage leads us through the genealogy of Jesus Christ. Ann points out in the introduction, "It's the way the Gift unwraps: you have Christ's family tree...before you have a Christmas tree. If you don't come to Christmas through Christ's family tree and you come into the Christmas story just at the Christmas tree – this is hard, to understand the meaning of His coming. Because without the genealogy of Christ, the limbs of His past, the branches of His family, the love story of His heart that has been coming for you since before the beginning – how does Christmas and its tree stand? Its roots would be sheared. Its meaning would be stunted. The arresting pause of the miracle would be lost."

Ann also suggests to the reader that each day we will actively wait. In the waiting we will begin to understand that the remaking of everything has already begun. In our reading we will spend time with the Old Testament stories, with each story, each word, pointing to the coming, the incarnation of God. She implores us to be still and go slow and find Him – the exquisite Gift, given for us. God's greatest gift!!!

This just may be a quieter Christmas season for you. What better time than this to become still, slow down and find The Christ in Christmas. We suggest doing this with the help of Ann Voskamp's, <u>The Greatest Gift</u>. You will be glad that you invested your time and your thoughts with this beautifully written book.
