## Inspiration Point

How many of you, with your spouses, planned to raise a family with the primary purpose for your children being to come and ask or beg for whatever they wanted? We would be very disappointed if that were the case, would we not? Yet that is the way we are with our Heavenly Father! He created us to worship Him and to have fellowship with Him, yet rarely do we speak to Him except to ask Him for something or another! The Bible is full of stories of people asking for and receiving answers to their prayers and Jesus Himself told us how to pray and expect our answers! But what kind of relationship would we have with our God and Father if all we did was to ask Him for things?

**Acts 13:1-4** *"Now there were in the church that was at Antioch certain prophets and teachers; Barnabus, and Simeon that was called Niger, and Lucious of Cyrene, and Manaen, which had been brought up with Herod the Tetrach, and Saul. AS THEY MINISTERED TO THE LORD, AND FASTED, the Holy Ghost said, "Separate unto Me Barnabus and Saul for the work whereunto I have called them." And when they had fasted and prayed, and layed hands on them, they sent them away. So they, being sent forth by the Holy Ghost, departed unto Seleucia; and from thence they sailed to Cyprus."*

Please note, the people were not petitioning to God to do anything. They were ministering to the Lord and fasting. Ministering to the Lord is called Praise and Worship. Think about all the hymns that we sing! They are beautiful and we love them, but they are to minister to us in the congregation. Even our sermons, and I am guilty of this, are to encourage and minister to the congregation. Now there is nothing wrong with this at all, but remember God created man to have fellowship with Him and for us to love Him and praise Him! In the Scriptures above, they were not petitioning God for anything! They were worshiping the Lord! They were praising Him for His goodness and mercy! They were showing Him love! When we draw nigh to God, He draws nigh to us! The Spirit was all over them for the intensity of their praise! It was then and only then, that the Holy Spirit manifested Himself by speaking to them!

Over in Acts 16:25 “ ***And at midnight, Paul and Silas prayed and sang praises unto God....***” You remember the story, Paul and Silas had been preaching and the people rose up against them. The magistrates seized them, tore off their clothes and had them beaten. They threw them into the inner prison, locked their feet in stocks. So, there they were, cut up, sore and bruised and it was midnight! The two of them began to pray out loud, to sing and to praise God! Everyone heard them! As their praise rang out, God heard them and sent an earthquake that rocked the jail to its foundation, setting them free and opening all the doors! They sang praises and worshiped, and God heard them and moved!

There are many incidents in the Bible where the people praised and worshiped God and then He moved! I suspect the reason we might not have the power we expect in our church services is because we have not learned how to praise and worship our dear Lord and Savior with our whole being! That is something we need to work on!

# From the Pastor's Desk


## God's Wake-up Call

## The Recipe Box

Some of us have, no doubt, tried to eat healthier and lighter after the first of the New Year. However, in February, a month of sweetness and love, we thought we would give you an easy recipe that allows you to treat those you love with a very special dessert! These little No-Bake Cherry Cheesecakes are portioned into single serving vessels...you can use wide-mouthed, pint canning jars, or make it even easier and just use short, small-sized, throw-away, plastic cups! Either way, these little desserts are certain to impress. Make them ahead of your meal and then just pull them out of the refrigerator to the oohs and ahhs of your guests! Or just serve them as a stand alone treat in the middle of the afternoon. And this recipe lends itself to your own brand of creativity. You can use any type of topping... strawberry, peach, crushed Oreos, caramel sauce... Just use whatever you think makes a great cheesecake topping! So easy! So beautiful! So tasty! Enjoy!!!

### No-Bake Cherry Cheesecakes


- 6 wide-mouthed jars, or 6 short, clear, plastic cups
- 1 ¼ cups graham cracker crumbs
- ¼ cup unsalted butter (softened)
- ¼ cup sugar
- 8 ounces plain cream cheese
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 1 can cherry pie filling



Combine graham cracker crumbs, butter, and sugar in a bowl. Mix until all of the ingredients are well coated in butter. Divide this mixture into six jars, pressing the crust to the bottom of the jar with a spoon. Use a mixer to beat together the cream cheese, powdered sugar, vanilla, and cream until fluffy and smooth. Divide the cream cheese mixture between the six jars and layer on top of the graham cracker crust. Refrigerate for 3-4 hours. Spoon the cherry pie filling on top of the cream cheese mixture, dividing it between the six jars. Refrigerate or serve immediately.



## Recommended Reading




Each month, we try to recommend a book to the church family that is inspiring, informative, entertaining, or exciting. Sometimes our suggestion is a book that is simply an escape from the complicated nature of today's world. And there are times when the value of a selection is in the academic content...maybe something from history or the realm of science. Some of our recommendations have been put forth with the express purpose of deepening your faith walk. And at other times we have recommended a biography to inspire life-change, or activism within the community. Many times, you may find that the book we are recommending seems to come from the female perspective...and you wouldn't be wrong because (spoiler alert!) the person who writes most of the *Recommended Reading* articles just happens to be a female!

However, this month, while still written by a female, the *Recommended Reading* selection just may appeal to all audiences! The main character of the book is a female, but there is quite a bit of military history related throughout the story. The time period for this tale is World War II, and although fictional, many actual occurrences are woven within. [The Flight Girls](#), by Noelle Salazar, shines a light on a little-known piece of history. Through this sweeping portrayal of the Women Airforce Service Pilots program, the fearlessness of these volunteers in the face of adversity is brought front and center and taking the time to acknowledge the contributions of these heroes is long overdue.

Our story begins in 1941. Audrey Coltrane has always wanted to fly. Her overwhelming desire to take to the skies drove her father to teach her how to do just that at a little airfield back home in Texas. Her desire to fly was also the reason she signed up to train military pilots in Hawaii when the war in Europe began. And it's why she insisted that she cannot become involved in a romantic relationship...being as flight-focused as she is. The action in the story truly takes a spellbinding and heart-stopping turn though, when Audrey gets caught in the air over Pearl Harbor, on that fateful day, just as the bombs begin to fall. Suddenly, nowhere feels safe.

As a way to make everything she loses count for something, Audrey joins the Women Airforce Service Pilots program. The friendships that are formed within that group reignite a spark of hope in the face of war and give Audrey the strength to cross the front lines and fight, not only for her country, but for all that truly matters to her.

[The Flight Girls](#) is rich with historical detail and is a powerful tale of courage and sacrifice by the Women Airforce Service Pilots during WWII. This validating and exciting novel points directly to the traits of fearlessness, love, and the power of friendship to make us soar! It is sure to captivate you from page one and then propel you into a story of courage and sacrifice that will possibly have you thinking about the early roles of women in the military in a way that you've never considered. 
Then, the first week of the new year was a struggle for us as Covid reared its ugly head among our ranks. Please keep us in your prayers as we recover and get back to normal.



## The JOY Group is on the Road Again!!!




## Lenten Sermon Series and Study



## Thursday Night Lenten Study


