## **Inspiration Point**

Ephesians 6:10-18 (KJV) "Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of His might. Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places. Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day and having done all to stand. Stand therefore, having your loins gird about with truth, and having on the breast plate of righteousness; and your feet shod with the preparation of the Gospel of peace; Above all taking the shield of faith, wherewith ye shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked. And take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God; praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints; ...."

As most of us do at one time or another, I was scrolling on my phone the other day. Without meaning to, I came across a person of power and influence in the organized occult. He served in a very high position over an area from Maine to Jamaica. This was noteworthy because I felt the strongest evil influence coming from him that I have ever felt in my years of ministry!

It is a quiet thing at first and you do not realize they have done so. Before long, the peace in your home will be disrupted! You will have strange temptations and dreams! Go through your home and remove all occult items! Movies, books, horoscopes, fortune telling, and then pray over the home! Plead the Blood of Jesus over all people who live there and cast the evil spirits out to wander in dry, dark places!

The spirit world is more real than the one you live in, and Satan lived for millennia with God in heaven. He knows God's ways more than we will ever find out! ## From the Pastor's Desk

Greetings Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

While preparing for our first Communion together, I began to think about the different ways that Christians encounter God's work of reconciliation through Jesus Christ. Rather than clinging to one theological viewpoint on the atonement (how human beings can be reconciled to God through Christ's sacrificial death), there are also many ways faith groups encounter and practice Holy Communion, and no one group has the one right way. Within all this diversity of Christian beliefs and practices, there is still one God offering God's-self to us and inviting us to join in the celebration feast!

The Body of Christ as described by the Apostle Paul, is a powerful way for us to think about how our many diverse human gifts are channeled through God's spirit for the

broader work of bringing Christ to a hungry world. The world isn't fed and changed despite the Body's diversity but because of it, and the Church always functions best when all people come together bringing with us our unique experiences, gifts, perspectives, and practices.

Could it be that when we come together to worship and receive Communion and to serve others, that we, like Christ, mysteriously become nourishment and restoration for our world? Sure, it is a fearful, divided, and hungry world, yet it's also a world with such diversity and promise, a world always on the verge of reawakening to the possibilities of God's love!

So, when it comes to following Jesus' words, "Do This in remembrance of Me," does it really matter if you take the cup this way or that, if you dip, sip, or bottoms up, if you wafer, cracker, or whole wheat? Does it really matter which one-way of atonement through which you practice your faith? For there is still one God, inviting us to join in the celebration feast, to bring our unique gifts together in love and unity and share them with our hungry world. Through the atoning sacrifice of Jesus Christ, and by God's mysterious Spirit, WE are called to be the Body of Christ, the Church!

I'm looking forward to us receiving the Sacrament of Holy Communion together on the first Sunday of each month, and I hope you will consider joining us to learn more about the various theories of atonement through our Thursday evening Lenten Bible Study.

# The Recipe Box

This month we are pleased to welcome a new voice to the *Pleasant News* volunteer staff!!! Peggy Green is taking on the role of our resident recipe guru and we couldn't be happier to have her! Each month, Peggy will provide us with a wonderful recipe that she feels will satisfy our church family in our desire to continue providing tasty meals for friends and family, or as we just want to spread our wings in the kitchen and try something new. Be sure to thank Peggy for her willingness and her volunteer spirit, as well as her cooking expertise, when you see her. We are so happy that she is now a part of *Pleasant News*!!!

St. Patrick's Day, celebrated on March 17<sup>th</sup>, was originally an event remembering St. Patrick as one of Ireland's patron saints. Religious services and feasts were a part of this observance. There are many delicious foods that have been adapted in the United States, coming out of this tradition. One of them is **Shepherd's Pie**, a wonderful comfort meal. Here is an easy version.

#### **Shepherd's Pie**

2 Tbsp. olive oil

1 cup chopped onion

1 lb. 90% lean ground beef

2 tsp. parsley

1 tsp. rosemary

½ tsp. salt

½ tsp. pepper

1 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce

2 cloves garlic

2 Tbsp. all-purpose flour

2 Tbsp. tomato paste

1 cup beef broth

1 ½ cup frozen mixed vegetables

2 packages "butter flavor" instant mashed potatoes

½ cup shredded cheddar cheese



Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Prepare a 9 x 13 baking dish by greasing or spraying with cooking spray. Add olive oil to a large skillet. Sauté onion for 5 minutes. Add beef, breaking it up in the pan. Add parsley, rosemary, salt, and pepper. Stir and cook for 6-8 minutes. Add garlic and Worcestershire sauce. Stir and cook for a minute or so. Add flour and tomato paste. Stir until the clumps of tomato paste are gone. Add frozen vegetables and broth. Bring to a boil, then reduce to simmer for 5 minutes, stirring occasionally. Set this aside. Prepare the 2 packages of instant, buttered, mashed potatoes. In the greased baking dish, spread a layer of potatoes. Then, spoon in meat mixture and top with remaining potatoes, covering the meat layer completely. Bake at 400 degrees for 25-30 minutes, uncovered. Remove from oven and sprinkle top with cheddar cheese. Return to oven and bake for 5 more minutes. Cool for 10 minutes before serving. M-m-m-m! Enjoy!!!


# **Recommended Reading**



The volunteers working on *Pleasant News* always try to recommend a good book to our church family in our monthly publication. Sometimes we suggest a work of fiction. Sometimes we think you might enjoy an informative read from history or science. Sometimes it's a biography, or autobiography, of an important figure in the Christian faith. And then there are the times that we recommend a book that just might change your life! The Power of Half, a true story by Kevin Salwen and Hannah Salwen, isn't a book chock full of spiritual truths. It isn't a book about some heroic effort to save a portion of humanity. It isn't even a book full of scriptures and important quotations. But it is the story of how one family's unassuming change in thought leads them to a

life that fulfills an ethical and spiritual imperative... "that in giving, we receive."


It all started when 14-year-old Hannah Salwen had a eureka moment. Seeing a homeless man in her neighborhood at the same time a glistening Mercedes pulled up, she said, "You know, Dad, if that man had a less nice car, that man there could have a meal." Until that day the Salwens had been caught up like so many of us as we pursue the American dream: providing a good life for their children, accumulating more and more stuff, doing their part but not really feeling it. So when Hannah was stopped in her tracks by this jarring disparity, her parents knew they had to act on her urge to do something. As a family, they made the extraordinary decision to sell their Atlanta dream house, downsize to a home half its size, and give half of the sale price to a worthy charity. What began as an unbelievable plan became a remarkable journey that transported them across the globe and well out of their comfort zone. In the end they learned that they had the power to change a little corner of the world...and they found themselves changing, too! Through the story of The Power of Half, families in all income brackets



can be inspired by one family's experience to boldly do something for others, to reconsider their spending and their stuff, and to live in better alignment with their values.

Although The Power of Half was published in 2010, its meaning and importance still ring true today. In reading this book you will be led to a new perspective on life. You won't be able to help but recommit to the values you hope to share with a younger generation...and you'll be reminded that the younger generation has much to teach you, too! The Power of Half is available from most booksellers. But you're in luck! It's also available in our own Lending Library. Just look for it on the bookshelves in the Gathering Room of the Family Life Center!

We thank Pleasant Grove for housing our program and allowing us to be together after school and during the summer. We pray that the entire Pleasant Grove family will stay safe and healthy!








## **PG Prayer Lunch**






## Lenten Sermon Series and Study




The church family recently received this note of thanks:
