From the Pastor's Desk

Inspiration Point

Romans 12:1-2 says: "I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect."

As Christians who want to walk closer to God, we need to study. As we do, that makes us a disciple of the Lord Jesus. To be a disciple, we need to develop discipline. Just doing normal worldly things does not make us disciples. The Bible teaches us that, "Whatever we ask God for, believe that you receive it, and you will have it." That takes faith in the Lord! Watching TV or reading novels do not build your faith. "Faith comes by hearing and hearing by the Word of God." We need to read the Word of God. We need to hear the Word of God and we need to put the Word of God to work in our daily lives! That takes discipline!

Our minds are like a fertile pot of soil. Whatever you put into it will grow up into a mature plant and produce fruit in our lives. If you plant cockle burrs, if you plant sand spurs, if you plant milkweeds, you will harvest those things! The Bible teaches us that whatsoever a man soweth, he reaps! If you plant lying, cheating, stealing, then you will ultimately become a liar, a cheat, or a thief! But if you have a daily discipline of reading and meditating on God's Word, filling your mind with the things the Bible teaches us, then you will become Christlike! You cannot change yourself, but The Helper, the Holy Spirit will use what you have planted to radically change you. This will enable you to renew your mind! Between this and a strong prayer life where you get up close and personal with God, you will learn how to always know the will of God!

There are many teachers that know **about** God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit, but they do not **know** God or Jesus or the Holy Spirit. You need to spend sincere alone time with Him! Set aside a special place in your home that you can use as your special Holy place! Go there at a regular time every day! Bring your study Bible, a pen, and a notepad. First settle your mind! Maybe some soft worship music will help. Talk to the Lord! He is not way up there somewhere. He is right there in your heart! Talk to him as you talk to your best friend. Ask him to forgive you of your sins. If there are problems that have stirred you up and give you no peace, talk to Him about them and give them over to Him to resolve! Worship Him by singing and praising Him. This leads to worship. That was what he brought you into the world to do! When you are right with God, you will find peace like you have never experienced! Then read your Bible. It is not important how much you read, only that you understand how your reading applies to your Christian walk. This is important! Meditate on what you read. Think about it... how it applies to you right where you are today. Close with a personal prayer to your Lord God! Walk away with peace!

Remember, to have close intimate friends, you must be honest and open with them. It is the same way with your relationship with God! If you promise Him something, be sure that you always do it! If you need His help, ask Him! You have a close personal relationship with Him after all! God loves you like His own child, and you can always trust Him!

May you be blessed this Easter season! It was for you that He died!

The Recipe Box

"Easter time is the time for eggs and the time for eggs is Easter time." This was a saying that my father-in-law used many times over the years. We never really knew what he was getting at with this saying...but we knew we would hear it more than once during the time leading up to Easter!

From a Christian perspective, Easter eggs represent Jesus' resurrection and his emergence from the tomb. When we open an empty plastic Easter egg, we are reminded that Jesus left that tomb and that the tomb is empty still today. Jesus is alive!



If you are eating Easter dinner here in the South, you expect to have eggs on the table. We usually like to see some old fashioned deviled eggs as one of our sides. But there are many other ways to use eggs around Easter. A quiche is a great way to serve eggs! The recipe we are sharing with you this month is delicious and can be served for an Easter brunch, or as a simple lunch or dinner. Serve it with hashbrown potatoes and fresh fruit for a complete meal! Enjoy!

Spinach Bacon Quiche

1 Tbsp. olive oil

9 pieces of bacon

1 small red onion, diced

5 ounces of fresh baby spinach, roughly chopped

6 large eggs

8-10 ounces from a can of evaporated milk (not the whole 12 ounce can)

1 ½ cups shredded cheddar cheese, divided

½ tsp. salt

½ tsp. pepper

1 package of refrigerator pie crust

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Lightly spray a deep-dish pie pan or quiche dish with cooking spray. Let your pie crust soften in the package for 20 minutes or so. Then, with a little flour, roll the crust out with a rolling pin, gently enlarging the crust to fit your deep dish pie pan. Lay the crust into your dish and mold it to fit. Set aside.

Sauté the onions and bacon in oil. Let the bacon cook until done so that you can chop it. Microwave the chopped spinach by itself in a micro-safe bowl for 1-2 minutes on high. Then separate the spinach with a fork. Add the chopped bacon and onion to the spinach. Allow to cool slightly.

In a large bowl, whisk eggs, milk, half of the cheese, salt, and pepper. Add onion, bacon, and spinach to the egg mixture. Pour all of this into your pie crust, adding the remaining cheese on top.

Bake at 350 degrees for 35 to 40 minutes. Use a toothpick to check for doneness. Let cool for 5-10 minutes. Serves six people.


Recommended Reading



Our lives are fraught with anxiety. Relational conflict, fears about our future, the constant barrage of information, worries over finances, the elusiveness of contentment...all of these can steal our joy because they steal our peace. Through Christ we are promised peace, but how can we find peace when the world we live in is overcome with chaos? In I Choose Peace, by Chip Ingram, we are reminded that peace isn't a feeling; it's a choice. Throughout this easy-to-read book, Ingram unpacks Philippians 4 to show us how we can choose peace in spite of circumstances. We can choose peace in our relationships, in moments of anxiety, within a broken world,

amidst difficult circumstances, and even while immersed in a materialistic culture.

As a way of inviting us to choose peace, Ingram reminds us of a well-known occurrence involving Jesus and His disciples. This Band of Believers was crossing the Sea of Galilee in a small boat when a violent storm came across the waters. Waves crashed over the boat and the men were terrified. They cried out to Jesus for help, only to find that He was resting peacefully. They woke Him and questioned His care and concern for them in light of their situation. Jesus, upon seeing their distress, simply calmed the storm and then asked the disciples why they were so faithless and afraid. Jesus had astonishing, supernatural peace. We know that this kind of peace is a promise in scripture, but most of us struggle with how to attain it. But Ingram has written I Choose Peace with the express intent of letting the reader know that "You already have it." Jesus actually gave His peace to all His followers the night before His crucifixion. "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid" (John 14:27). Now, we must understand that this promise is for the peace that Jesus has, not the kind of peace the world tries to give us.



So, when we each enter into a relationship with Jesus Christ, why don't we automatically experience this supernatural peace? It sounds like such a simple question. And it is. The answer is also quite simple. The reason this peace is difficult for us to have is that we must willfully and purposefully choose to walk in the peace He gave us. Even though we already have it, we tend to pursue peace on the world's terms. The world offers peace to us if and when we are successful, accomplished, beautiful, wealthy, famous, or secure. It holds an ideal forward that most people can never attain, and those who do attain these goals find out it isn't all that it promises. And in the process, this approach robs us of the peace we've already been given.

<u>I Choose Peace</u> will help you overcome the challenges that rob us of Jesus's peace. As you read, you will discover the biblical truths that allow us to experience deep, lasting peace even while we struggle in some very important areas of our lives. You will be exposed to the theological basis for experiencing the peace of Christ, but the focus isn't on theory alone. It's actually about experiencing it and by the close of the book you will have numerous practical steps you can take to experience the fullness of the peace Jesus promised and gifted to us.

If you are tired of feeling anxious over the state of the world, your relationships, or your own heart, this encouraging book, <u>I Choose Peace</u>, will help you quiet your worries and experience genuine, lasting peace that doesn't depend on what's going on around you.

We strongly recommend <u>I Choose Peace</u> to our entire church family. We all know that these are challenging times and finding peace within our lives can be a struggle. Sometimes we need to learn something new to overcome anxiety within a biblical context, but sometimes we just need to be reminded of the goodness and provision of God. This book will, more than likely, do both for you! It is available through many online booksellers and is, of course, in our own Lending Library. It is our prayer that you will, through the teachings in this book, experience peace in your own life.

After School Care Post




