Gardens have been planted and hopes are high that there will be a bountiful harvest of fruits and vegetables! One vegetable that has been harvested is the zucchini. Such a versatile veggie...it can be fried, sauteed, baked, and dipped. It can also make a beautiful loaf of bread. Here's a simple but delicious recipe for Zucchini Bread given to me by my neighbor in Currituck County, Jo Anderson. I hope that you will enjoy baking, sharing, and eating this seasonal delight!!! Enjoy!

Zucchini Bread

3 large eggs, beaten
1 cup oil
2 cups sugar
2 cups grated zucchini
2 tsp. vanilla
3 cups all-purpose flour
1 tsp. baking soda
¼ tsp. baking powder
1 tsp. salt
3 tsp. cinnamon
½ cup chopped walnuts or raisins



Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a large bowl, beat eggs and add sugar. Then add oil and vanilla and mix well. In a separate bowl, combine all dry ingredients. Then add dry ingredients to the first bowl. Add grated zucchini a bit at a time. Then fold nuts or raisins into the mixture. Spoon batter into one 9 x 5 loaf pan, or two 8 x 4 pans. Bake for one hour. Check for doneness with a toothpick. Cool for 5 to 10 minutes before removing from pan.

***Here are some variations that you might like to try: 1) add a cup of chocolate chips to batter, 2) add a cup of blueberries or other berries, 3) make muffins instead, baking for 15-25 minutes, 4) make multiple loaves to use up your zucchini and freeze several loaves for use throughout the fall and winter.


Recommended Reading



Well, summer certainly has arrived...and with it, the heat that is a Carolina summer. Even with the heat, we still need to get outside to take care of the yard and all those flowers that seemed so essential back in April and May! We also need to visit across the fence with our neighbors, watch the kids in the yard or the pool, and we may even feel the need to wash the car occasionally! But most of us are probably spending much of our time indoors. Oh, we can sometimes steal an hour in the early morning or in the late evening when the sun is not so intense, but, for the most part, we are enjoying the air conditioning, and giving thanks for the luxury of having it!

While indoors, the perfect activity is reading! This month's recommendation comes to us from our own dear, sweet, Lib Primm. During a recent visit with Lib, she shared her enjoyment of <u>Poster Girls</u>, the debut novel of Meredith Ritchie, a resident of Charlotte. This book had been recommended to her by her brother and sister-in-law and it proved to be a great suggestion. Lib shared that the story is set in Charlotte, during World War II, and that it revolved around the Shell Assembly Plant that was in the Steele Creek area. Although it is a work of fiction, Lib told me that it chronicles the daily ordeals of the working women of the time. Most of the employees were wives of servicemen, doing what they could to support their families and to support the war efforts that hit so close to home. Well, needless to say, I was hooked! I went right home, ordered a copy for myself, and then thoroughly enjoyed all the humor, heartache, and heroics woven throughout this novel.

The principal character in Poster Girls is Maggie Slone, a military wife and mother who takes a job at Charlotte's largest wartime employer, the massive and dangerous Shell Plant. Meanwhile, Alabama native, Kora Bell, uses her steadfast determination to navigate the challenges she faces as a Black woman seeking her own employment under Jim Crow. A shared love of books begins an unlikely friendship between Kora and Maggie, and these two women join forces to unify the plant's workforce. Very strict rules are necessary when the air is charged with gun powder and the conventions of polite society in the South. That is, until Maggie and Kora must break some of these rules in order to support their families, work toward ending the war, and bringing both of their husbands home. This entertaining and thought-provoking story, told from two different perspectives, is built upon the true but oftentimes forgotten events and accomplishments of a diverse group of American women. Poster Girls is a beautiful work of historical fiction. It weaves together friendship, loyalty, grief, and the tumult of war, creating a story that will stay with you long after you close the cover on the last page.



You can find <u>Poster Girls</u> from online booksellers, such as Amazon. But you can also find it in our own Lending Library at Pleasant Grove. We encourage you to pick it up, be inspired, enjoy the read, and stay cool!!! Happy Reading!!!

Phil Turner agreed to chair this committee and stated that committee membership would consist of volunteers and "draftees."

Getting to Know Pastor Glenda!!!



On July 9th, we were so happy to welcome Rev. Glenda Bennet to Pleasant Grove United Methodist Church! While we have already enjoyed several Sundays with her, we realize that, as is always the case, we need to get to know our new minister while they are with us and already on the job. This is a process, and one that Pastor Glenda welcomes and looks forward to. *Pleasant News* recently asked her to supply us with some basic biographical information that we might share with the church family. In doing so, we all get a glimpse into Glenda's life

and career thus far. We also can find common ground with Pastor Glenda that will certainly springboard us all into a deep and long-lasting relationship with her that is built on shared interests and the love of Christ, one to another.

Glenda's full name is Glenda Elizabeth Everest Bennett. She was born on March 6th, 1964. She married Dennis on February 8th, 1992. Dennis's birthday is March 7, 1964. (These two were born just one day apart!) They have one son, William. He is known as Will to everyone except family. Glenda attended Davie High School and graduated in 1982. She then attended High Point University, graduating in 1998 with a double major: Bachelor of Science in Accounting and Bachelor of Science in Business Administration. As she responded to God's call on her life, she attended Hood Theological Seminary, graduating in 2004, with a Master's of Divinity. Two Ways to Help Others



As the new school year approaches, our sweet church family has a couple of different opportunities to help others. We do hope that everyone that calls Pleasant Grove home will choose to be a part of one or both efforts. Both ways of blessing someone else revolve around Oakdale Elementary School. And they both focus on helping the students who are our neighbors.

First, Oakdale School requires their students to wear uniforms and maintains a uniform closet. This closet serves students who might have an accident at school (and accidents take many different forms) which brings about a need for a fresh, clean uniform

replacement. We will be collecting uniform items for Oakdale's uniform closet. Please consider donating the following items:

- White, baby blue, or navy-blue shirts for both girls and boys
- Khaki or navy-blue pants for both girls and boys

Any size will be appreciated but there is a special need for the larger children's sizes. Administration tells us that they even need some adult sizes. Uniform clothing can be purchased at WalMart, Target, Amazon, Kohl's, or any of the department stores. If you are unable to shop for these items and would rather make a monetary donation, you may do so by turning in your contribution to the church office or placing it in the offering baskets. Just be sure to mark your donation for Oakdale Uniforms. We will then take the donations and go on a shopping spree to stock Oakdale's uniform closet!!!

The second opportunity to serve comes in the form of personal hygiene kits. From time to time, it becomes evident that a student doesn't have the hygiene items that they need as they grow and mature. We can put together a simple kit that can be given to students when this need arises. These items can be purchased anywhere and are certainly available at local dollar stores. The assembly of these kits is quite simple. Purchase the needed items and place them in a gallon-sized zip top bag. Please remember that these kits are to be given to both girls and boys, so the items need to be appropriate for both or, if gender specific, marked as such. The items are:

- New wash cloth
- Bar of soap
- Deodorant
- Toothpaste
- Toothbrush
- Lotion (travel size)
- Wet wipes (travel pack)



We will collect the uniform items and the hygiene kits during the month of August. You will find collection bins in the sanctuary, and we look forward to seeing our bins full to the brim before the end of the month!!! Thanks in advance for being a part of these efforts. Together, as we reach across the road with the love of Christ, we can make a difference in the life of a child!!!
