From the Pastor's Desk

WOW! Can you believe it is already September? It has been a busy summer and seems to have flown by. Now it's time to turn our attention to fall – cooler weather, pumpkins, and the beautiful colors of the trees. We won't talk about raking those leaves, although the piles sure are fun to jump in! The kids have returned to school and that always brings up memories for me of those shopping trips for new school clothes each year.

In the weeks before school started, my mother and I would assess my closet to determine what still fit, what was still wearable, and what needed to be replaced. I always secretly hoped it all needed to be replaced so I could get a whole new wardrobe. That was never the case, which was a good thing because we never could have afforded a whole new wardrobe. But I would get some new things, as the budget allowed. I was always so excited about those new clothes and couldn't wait to wear them. However, in North Carolina, kids usually do have to wait to wear their new school clothes because those clothes are for cooler weather and it's still hot when they go back to school.

In Paul's letter to the Colossians, he talks about our new clothes as Christians. In the 3rd chapter verses 9-14, he says:

"You're done with that old life. It's like a filthy set of ill-fitting clothes you've stripped off and put in the fire. Now you're dressed in a new wardrobe. Every item of your new way of life is custom-made by the Creator, with his label on it. All the old fashions are now obsolete. Words like Jewish and non-Jewish, religious and irreligious, insider and outsider, uncivilized and uncouth, slave and free, mean nothing. From now on everyone is defined by Christ, everyone is included in Christ. So, chosen by God for this new life of love, dress in the



wardrobe God picked out for you: compassion, kindness, humility, quiet strength, discipline. Be even-tempered, content with second place, quick to forgive an offense. Forgive as quickly and completely as the Master forgave you. And regardless of what else you put on, wear love. It's your basic, all-purpose garment. Never be without it." (From The Message)

Paul uses the metaphor of old and new clothes to talk about our old life without Christ and our new life with Christ. Paul tells us to take off the old clothes. Remove the garments of lust, idolatry, greed, bad temper, irritability, and meanness. That stuff is all part of the old life.

It's easy to want to hold on to old clothes, maybe someday they will fit again. It's easy to hold on to our idolatry, putting other things ahead of God, being too busy to go to church to worship God or to study His word or to pray. It's easy to hold on to bad feelings we have toward someone. It's easy to fall into gossip. It's easy to pull irritability out of the closet.

But Paul says that's all part of your old wardrobe. You are done with that. Don't keep those things around. Burn them.

Fortunately, Paul doesn't stop there. Paul says WE DO GET A WHOLE NEW WARDROBE, not just a few new clothes. And these new clothes are designed just for you, with Christ's label on it. Old labels no longer apply. Those labels that we so often want to use – racial labels, religious labels, us and them labels, socio-economic labels, crude labels, ill-mannered labels, and all those other labels – they are gone.

Our new wardrobe has only Christ's label. That wardrobe consists of: Compassion for all people; Kindness toward others, even if they are not kind to you; Humility; Even-temperedness even if provoked; Discipline in

our daily lives in order to make Christ's label evident in our life; Quiet Strength because you can get through whatever life throws at you; and Forgiveness the same as He has shown you.

And regardless of what else you put on, wear love. It's your basic, all-purpose garment. Never be without it. When we wear the label of Christ, we are wearing the wardrobe of the highest value possible.



September is upon us with fresh, juicy apples ready to be picked! Apples come in many varieties, though some are better for pie-making than others. Granny Smith apples are perfect for this Apple Crumb Pie, which has been adapted from two separate recipes. We hope you enjoy this scrumptious pie, perhaps with a dollop or two of vanilla ice cream!

Apple Crumb Pie

1 deep-dish pie crust (Frozen is just fine, but homemade works too, if you are feeling industrious!) **Topping:**

1 cup flour
½ cup white sugar
½ cup brown sugar
1 tsp. cinnamon
1 tsp. vanilla
1 stick margarine or butter, chilled and cubed
Mix the above ingredients with a fork until combined and crumbly. Set aside.
Filling:
6 Granny Smith apples, or 8 apples if you are making two pies
1/3 cup sugar
3 TBSP. flour
1 tsp. cinnamon
½ TBSP. lemon juice
¼ tsp. nutmeg



Preheat oven to 450 degrees.

Peel, core, and slice the apples ¼ inch thick. Mix sugar, flour, cinnamon, lemon juice, and nutmeg. Pour in the bowl with apples and toss together.

In a deep-dish pie crust, lay the filling into the pie. Pile higher in the middle and gradually go down to the sides. It will be full! Add the topping to cover the whole pie, patting it down as you go. (You may have more topping than you want to use. Feel free to adjust.)

Put pie on a cookie sheet and place in a 450-degree oven for 15 minutes. Reduce temperature to 350 degrees and bake for 45 minutes more. Keep an eye on the crust as you go.

Serve warm or at room temperature. Enjoy!!!


Recommended Reading



For September we are going to recommend a book by an author that we have written about in months past. Susan Meissner, author of <u>The Shape of Mercy</u>, has another title that we think our church family might enjoy. <u>White Picket Fences</u> is the story of a seemingly perfect suburban family...stable marriage, nice home, two great kids, a dog, and all the right connections. But, in this novel, Meissner explores the fact that all is not always as it seems. In this instance, as is the case so many times, there is more beneath the surface than we can readily perceive. Family secrets sometimes smolder behind the proverbial white picket fence.

When Amanda Janvier's black sheep brother disappears, she takes in her sixteen-year-old niece. Her niece, Tally, is practically an orphan, having lost her mother at an early age and being raised by a father that parents her from wherever he decides to move next. Amanda thinks that she, her husband, and their two children can give Tally some stability and, for at least a time, a good shot at a "normal" life. Seventeen-year-old Chase hasn't seen his cousin in years. He is curious about her unconventional life, but he doesn't expect that her arrival will have much of an impact on his. As Tally enters Chase's life, he seems to have a growing, and somewhat disturbing, interest in a long-ago house fire that plagues his dreams and eludes his conscious memory. Surprisingly, Chase and Tally bond as they visit with and interview two Holocaust survivors for a sociology project. Through this process they come to realize that the whole family is struggling with hidden secrets, with the shadows of the past, and with the realization that just turning your back on tragic situations will not make them go away. As you make your way through the rich characters and the family connections in <u>White Picket Fences</u>, you will ask yourself if Tally's presence will blow apart the Janvier's perfectly constructed lives, or will she be able to help them find the truth without losing each other. Will keeping the illusion of the white picket fence be more important to this family than finding the truth and dealing with it together?

<u>White Picket Fences</u> is a great read! The storyline has many layers from current day, a house fire from thirteen years ago, the mystery of Tally's father and what he is really doing while in Europe, and the horror of the Holocaust and all that it cost so many. We think that anyone in our church family would enjoy the read. It is available from the public libraries, any online bookseller, and of course, right here in our own Lending Library! Happy Reading!!!




