Inspiration Point

I do not know for sure, but I think Mary was about 15 or 16 years old when she got pregnant with Jesus! I would think Joseph was about 25 or 26. Every woman in Israel knew the Messiah was coming and they hoped they would be the one chosen! But God chose Mary! What kind of woman was Mary that God would choose her to carry His only begotten Son? I expect that she was a strong person, well mannered, humble, loving and kind! I would think that her parents had raised her right from the start. I also believe that she had a heart for God! She was faithful in her worship and her prayers! God's heart had a soft spot in it for Mary!

Let us look at Joseph! What kind of person was he? God chose him to be the father figure in Jesus's life. He was a carpenter, worked with wood, and was obviously highly skilled at what he did. In his day there were several villages around the Sea of Galilee and some of them housed some very prosperous Roman officials. Joseph's work would have been steady. He would be very strong, and his hands would be rough and calloused. He had a heart for God as well! He was a good man and always did right by his fellow man. Their marriage would have been an arranged one, with Joseph providing a dowry for his wife. Once the marriage contract was signed, there was a waiting period and then the wedding! It would have been a marvelous celebration!

Now, Mary and Joseph lived in the town of Nazareth. But there was a problem, you see. Prophesy said that the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem! Do you suppose that it was a coincidence that the Roman Emperor, August, called for a census at that time? I think not! It was 75 to 80 miles from Nazareth to Bethlehem and they would travel on foot. Joseph did own a donkey, so their clothes, supplies, and Mary would ride on that! Can you imagine this very pregnant (9 months' worth) young girl riding 3 to 4 days on a donkey over rough terrain? It probably took closer to 5 days, and she would be very tired!

Bethlehem was not a large place, and there were just a few rooming houses. Because they had to travel so slowly, all the rooms were taken when they arrived. One innkeeper saw Mary's condition and allowed them to bed down in his stable. At least it was shelter and there was clean straw to bed down on. It would not have been too long before Mary would feel the birth pains. Jesus was born just like all the babies at that time. The Bible does not say it, but they had midwives to help with the birthing of babies then. If one were available, I am sure Joseph would have gotten her one! While Jesus's birth itself was not something spectacular, God had a plan! He was going to put on a show!

Now, many folks made a living owning sheep during that time, and they would gather at night, put the sheep in a pen and watch over them by the fires. The fires kept them warm and kept the wild animals away from the sheep. They probably had dinner and were sitting around telling stories or maybe doing some chores. That is when God chose to reveal His Beloved Son to the world! An Angel appeared in the sky, shining brilliantly like the sun! They shrunk back and were afraid! **The Angel spoke to them**, **"Do not be afraid!" he said**, **"I bring you** good news that will bring great joy to all the people. The Savior, yes, the Messiah, the Lord, has been born today in Bethlehem, the city of David! And you will recognize him by this sign: You will find a baby wrapped snugly in strips of cloth, lying in a manger." Suddenly the Angel was joined by a whole host of others—the Armies of Heaven—praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and peace on earth to those in whom God is pleased!"

Then they went back to heaven as quickly as they had come! Would you say this was a big deal? This baby has changed the whole world! Even today we celebrate His birthday, and it is celebrated all around the world! He has paid for our salvation by dying and shedding his own blood for the forgiveness of our sins on the cross! Many of our loved ones are now in heaven, living lives of peace and joy forever! One day you and I will join them there and won't that be a time of rejoicing!

This Christmas, as we gather around the table with our families, let's remember it is not about the material things, but about our Savior who loves us so deeply! Let His love shine through you to those around you! Take the time to tell them how much you love them!

From the Pastor's Desk

TREASURING CHRISTMAS LUKE 2:19

In the Christmas story, I like how Luke used the phrase, "All who heard the shepherd's story were astonished, but Mary quietly treasured those things in her heart and thought about them often." (Luke 2:19)

The King James says, "Mary kept all these things and pondered them in her heart."

It means that year after year she thought about the events leading to the first Christmas -- how she was chosen to participate in God's story of salvation, how God brought everything together, how she witnessed



firsthand that, like the angel had said to her many months before, "Nothing is impossible for God." (Luke 1:37)

Mary's example is a good one to follow. We should remember to treasure these things and think about them often. There are so many lessons to be learned from the nativity story.

• From the wisemen we learn that God speaks to anyone who will listen, and he leads anyone who is willing to follow.

• From Mary and Joseph, we learn what it means to fully submit to the will of God. We learn that obedience takes courage, and that it's better to obey God than worry about what others think or say.

- From the shepherds -- those minimum wage workers who were watching sheep late in the night -- we learn that no one is too poor or too insignificant to have a personal experience with God.
- Even from cruel Herod, we are reminded of how foolish it is to try to hinder the purpose of God.
- Most of all, from Jesus, we learn that God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life.

We're beginning a busy season of the year -- stressful sometimes, hectic, and financially challenging. Follow Mary's example: Remember to remember the first Christmas. Treasure the story, think about it often, and ponder its meaning in your heart.

"It's the most wonderful time of the year!!!" And it is during the Christmas season that we enjoy some of the most wonderful kitchen creations of the entire year! We allow those little indulgences, those special sweet treats, those dishes that take just a little extra time and effort, to take front and center of the holiday table. It is

also when we tend to share with friends and neighbors in a more intentional way. But a special Christmas treat doesn't have to be complicated and involved. It doesn't have to have an ingredient list as long as your arm. A special sweet treat for your table, or a little goodie bag to send home with your loved ones can have a few simple ingredients, can be quick to put together, and can still be beautiful to look at and deeply appreciated.

This month's recipe fits the bill! **White Christmas Peppermint Oreo Bark** has three easy ingredients, takes about 30 minutes to put together, and will be the talk of your guests at Christmastime. Put some of this sweetness on a Christmas platter for grazing. Pass it around after your main course as just that little something sweet we all enjoy after a good meal. Or tie a few pieces up together in a cellophane bag and send it home with your guests. Either way, this versatile little goodie is sure to delight one and all...it's so good you just might need to make more than one batch!!!



White Christmas Peppermint Oreo Bark

20 ounces white chocolate Candiquik, or white chocolate morsels 16 Oreos, roughly chopped 1/3 cup crushed peppermint candy canes For both the Oreos and the candy canes, you can put them in separate resealable bags and then crush them with your rolling pin. Just have fun with it!

Line a 9x13 rimmed baking pan with parchment paper, making sure that extra paper hangs over the sides for easy lifting once the chocolate is hardened. Set the pan aside. In a medium bowl, break 8 ounces of white chocolate into pieces, or pour 8 ounces of chocolate morsels. Microwave until fully melted and smooth. Be sure to stop and stir every 30 seconds so that the chocolate doesn't burn. Once chocolate is melted, spread onto prepared pan using a spatula or knife. White chocolate should cover the entire pan in a thin layer. Top with crushed Oreo cookies. Place the pan in the refrigerator for about ten minutes to allow it to harden. As the Oreo layer is hardening, melt the remaining 12 ounces of white chocolate in the microwave until smooth, taking care not to burn the chocolate. Remove pan from refrigerator and spread the second batch of chocolate over the top of the Oreo layer in another even layer, covering the entire first layer. Sprinkle crushed candy canes over the top. Place in the refrigerator for 15 minutes to harden completely. Once ready, remove from the refrigerator and lift parchment paper by overhanging edge and set on counter. Chocolate will lift right out of the paper. Break into pieces by hand or using a knife. Bark will keep in an airtight container for up to one month if left on the counter or will keep in the refrigerator for several months...if it stays around that long!!!


Recommended Reading



So many times, when we think of the cold, wintry evenings that approach, we also think of snuggling in with a mug of hot cocoa, a comforting warm blanket, and a good book. If this is how you wish to spend at least a few of your winter nights, then we have just the book for you! <u>The Secret of Snow</u>, by Viola Shipman, is a beautifully written story about second chances, realizing that you usually can't escape your past, and the beauty of a small town at Christmastime.

When Sonny Dunes, a Southern California meteorologist who is all about sunshine and seventy-two-degree days, suddenly loses her job, she finds herself in quite the

predicament. She is being replaced by a virtual meteorologist that will never age, gain weight, or renegotiate its contract! And she finds that the only television station willing to give the fifty-year-old meteorologist another shot is the very place Sonny's been avoiding since the day she left for college...her Northern Michigan hometown; a place where winters can be painfully long and dark, dominated by a phenomenon known as lake-effect snow. So, she grudgingly returns to the long, snowy winter of her childhood with the added humiliation of moving back in with her mother. Sonny quickly discovers that she is not quite an outsider but no longer a local. She also finds that her past is blindsiding her from every direction: from the high school friends she ghosted, to the former journalism classmate and mortal frenemy who is now her boss, to, most impactfully, the long-ago death of her younger sister who dearly loved the snow, as well as the mother who caused Sonny to leave her hometown in the first place.



To distract herself from the unwelcome memories and the obstacles before her, Sonny decides to throw herself headfirst into covering every small-town winter event. From sledding and ice fishing, to skiing and winter festivals, the merrymaking culminates with the town's famed Winter Ice Sculpture Contest. All of this serves as a distraction, yes. But it also is her effort to woo a new audience and cement her second chance at success in her hometown. The town's winter events are run by the director of the chamber of commerce, whose genuine love of Michigan, all things winter, and Sonny, draw the two of them together time after time. He has optimism to spare and makes Sonny's forays into winning over the town all-the-more bearable. However, with someone trying to undermine her efforts to rebuild her career, she must make peace with who she used to be and allow her heart to thaw if she's ever going to find a place she can truly call home.

With the forecast calling for a reluctant homecoming and some regrettable decisions with a strong chance for romance, Sonny might just be able to thaw her heart and restart her life in a way she never could have predicted! <u>The Secret of Snow</u> is an enjoyable read with believable characters and backstories. It is also a story with humor and hope! We genuinely believe that you will enjoy this book and encourage you to borrow it from our very own Lending Library at Pleasant Grove!
