

From the Pastor's Desk

The difference between controlling the future and predicting it. . .

1 Peter 1:2 NIV

who have been chosen according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, through the sanctifying work of the Spirit, to be obedient to Jesus Christ and sprinkled with his blood: Grace and peace be yours in abundance.

CONSIDER THIS

Foreknowledge. We don't really grasp the biblical concept of foreknowledge. Something in us wants God's foreknowledge to be determinative and even controlling. So, what if God's foreknowledge is not determinative but rather predictive? Here's my thesis: God doesn't control the future as a predetermined outcome. He accurately predicts the future according to how one responds to His Word. I know this may ruffle some feathers so suspend your judgment at least to the end of the entry.

The Greek word behind "foreknowledge" is "prognosis." When a doctor gives a prognosis, they tell you what the expected outcome of a disease and prescribed remedy. Aunt Mildred has cancer. We want to know, "What's the prognosis?" The doctor said they think they caught it early and with radiation and some chemotherapy they can beat it. A doctor's foreknowledge or prognosis is tentative and subject to being wrong. The foreknowledge or prognosis of God, while predictive, is a certainty. God the Father gives a prognosis for anyone who will follow Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit. Their life will flourish, and as Peter's letter will show us—even in the midst of great difficulty.

I want you to hear Psalm 1, which is a perfect example of the whole concept of foreknowledge or prognosis as accurately predictive.

Blessed is the one who does not walk in step with the wicked or stand in the way that sinners take or sit in the company of mockers, but whose delight is in the law of the Lord, and who meditates on his law, day and night. That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither— whatever they do prospers. Not so the wicked! They are like chaff that the wind blows away. Therefore, the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the assembly of the righteous. For the Lord watches over the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked leads to destruction.

POP QUIZ:

1.What is the prognosis (aka God's foreknowledge) for the one whose delight is in the law of the Lord and who meditates on his law, day and night?

2. What is the prognosis (aka God's foreknowledge) for those who walk in step with the wicked, stand in the way of sinners, and sit in the seat of mockers (aka "the wicked")?

O.K., one more example of how Divine prognosis or predictive foreknowledge works. This one comes as the closing words of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount.

"Therefore, everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock. But everyone who hears these words of mine and does not put them into practice is like a foolish man who built his house on sand. The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell with a great crash." Matthew 7:24-27

Now re-read 1 Peter 1:2 in this light:

who have been chosen according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, through the sanctifying work of the Spirit, to be obedient to Jesus Christ and sprinkled with his blood...

Pray this Prayer

Jesus, you are the Messiah, the Son of the Living God. Thank you for the grace of your prognosis and for revealing it to us. You tell us what will happen. You give us the choice of life or death, of blessing or curses. Oh, that I would hear your voice and not harden my heart. Holy Spirit would you soften my heart and attune my ears to hear your voice today and to respond to your grace. Praying in Jesus name, Amen.



The take home question:

What is it about us that wants to equate the concept of predictive foreknowledge or prognosis with determinative omniscience and control?

The Recipe Box

If you have been around Pleasant Grove for more than a minute, you know that we are blessed with some of the best cooks around! When you think back to the many church family gatherings that we have had here at church, you, no doubt, associate certain dishes with certain cooks. That Asian version of coleslaw...she always brings it, and you love it! That chicken dish with the unusual name...he always shows up with that one! And that banana pudding, it's always in her same bowl and you make a beeline for it!

This month we bring you a recipe from one of those legendary cooks. Pina Nance is well-known for the dishes she brings to our church gatherings, but she is also known for the family meals she hosts at her home. It's nothing for her to put on a spread for her big family, sometimes fifteen or more in attendance. They come together to celebrate engagements, weddings, new babies, graduations, and even just a normal Sunday afternoon! And although the food is second to none, it is the love Pina pours into her family that can be sensed most plainly.

The recipe below, known to Pina's family as Mom's Cookies, has been in the family for as long as anyone can remember. Pina's Mom found the recipe in a copy of Progressive Farmer magazine sometime in the 1950s. She convinced her grandsons, Terry and Rick, that it was just like eating candy. (Lee wasn't even born yet!) After her mom's passing, the cookies became a staple in Pina's kitchen. Lee says that his friends always looked forward to Mom's Cookies, as have Pina's grandkids and great grandkids. He also says that college care packages from Pina never lasted very long when there were Mom's Cookies included.

This simple, no-bake cookie recipe uses ingredients you probably already have in your kitchen. When you combine ingredients with the same love that Pina puts into her cooking, your efforts become a labor of love! We are excited to share this recipe with you. Who knows? Mom's Cookies just might become a steady presence in your own kitchen!!!


Top-of-the-Stove Cookies (Mom's Cookies)

½ cup unsweetened cocoa
½ cup butter or margarine (one stick)
2 cups sugar
½ cup milk
½ cup peanut butter, creamy or crunchy
1 tsp. vanilla
3 cups quick oats, uncooked OR 2 cups oats and 1 cup flaked coconut

In a saucepan, bring cocoa, butter, sugar, and milk to a boil. Stirring constantly, boil the mixture for two minutes. Remove from heat. Add peanut butter and vanilla. Mix well. Add the oats OR oats and coconut and mix well. Working quickly, drop mixture in rounded teaspoons onto wax paper to cool. The cookies will firm up. (Don't make these in damp weather as they will not set up.) Makes about two dozen cookies.



Recommended Reading



This month's Recommended Reading selection offers a good read to both men and women who like a good story and who need a little inspiration. Courageous, by Randy Alcorn, Alex Kendrick, and Stephen Kendrick, has as its tag line, "Honor Begins at Home." And while the story does give the reader insights into the professional life of a policeman on the streets of a tough city, it does indeed focus on the life that a policeman leads after he removes his badge for the day.

From two screenplay writers and a novelist comes the inspirational story of everyday heroes who long to be the kinds of dads that make a lifelong impact on their

own children. This theme of family leadership is examined through the lens of a Biblical perspective but is then applied in a current-day environment. These men grapple daily with the question, "What happens to a fatherless home?" They come to realize that it takes more than having children to be a father. It takes courage!!! And when fathers fail to follow the will of their Heavenly Father, the results are disastrous. Police officers Alex, Nathan, Shane, and David continually deal with gang related crime in Albany, Georgia. They see car-jackings, drug deals, theft, and gun violence. They are witnesses to the pain and brokenness that result when fathers are absent. And, even in the face of sobering circumstances, these four policemen consistently give their best while on the job.



But it seems that good enough is all they have to offer to their own children. They quickly discover that their standards are missing the mark when it comes to fatherhood. They know that God desires to see their hearts turned to their children, but their own children seem to be drifting farther and farther away from them. They turn to their faith in God and their study of His Word to find a way to serve and protect those who are most dear to them. When tragedy hits home, they are left struggling with their hopes, fears, faith, and fathering. With a newfound urgency, and a strong sense of resolution, these dads draw closer to God and closer to their own children simultaneously.

With heart-pounding plot twists and affirming story lessons, Courageous is hard to put down. It is an excellent read for anyone who has influence on today's youth...especially anyone who is living life as a father to a young person. You can find this book from many online booksellers but it can also be found in our Lending Library at Pleasant Grove. We encourage everyone to read Courageous and be reminded of the enormous impact we can all have for Christ in the lives of young people today.

"I've read a couple of those books you gave me." Adam pulled out a battered volume that he'd borrowed from Tom. "*The Knowledge of the Holy* is really something: What comes into our minds when we think of God is the most important thing about us." "Very good. You see how it feeds your mind and heart in ways the newspaper and television never will?" Adam nodded. "But I'm no theologian." "We're all theologians, Adam. Either good ones or bad ones. I'd rather be a good one, wouldn't you?"




You Did It Again, Pleasant Grove!!!
